Extra containers for waste collection

1 - The following unit fees shall be charged for the maintenance and cleaning of garbage container:

a) Supply: 52 €/container (for undividable period of 30 days);

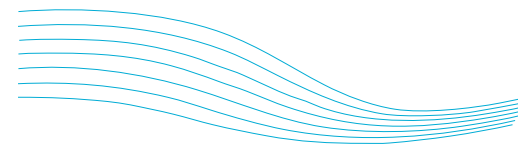
b) Maintenance and cleaning: 72 €/month and container.

2 – For the supply of other kinds of containers the requester shall be charged the price invoiced by the service provider plus 33%.

Overtime service provision

Waste collection outside normal working hours is subject to a surcharge to cover staff costs and equipment needed, in accordance with the tariffs established in the APFF, S.A. Regulations.

Collection of ship and cargo waste in the Figueira da Foz Port 2019

1. Aim

Under the terms of the European Parliament and the Council Directive n.º 2000/59/EC, of 27th November, the Figueira da Foz Port has the operational means and effective rules to undertake waste collection, to facilitate and encourage the waste delivery through the ships that dock at the port ensuring proper transportation to an appropriate final destination.

3. Waste management rules

Procedures governing the waste's collection, transport and destination are outlined in the Waste Management Regulations.

The Figueira da Foz Port has the necessary facilities to ship waste collection, under the terms of the legislation in force.

Ships must take all the ship generated waste off board and also ensure the delivery of the cargo residues.

4. Prohibitions

It is forbidden to leave waste in all the Figueira da Foz Port jurisdiction area as well as to put it in an improper place or container; it is also forbidden to mix recyclable waste, including oil waste with different characteristics that makes it impossible to recycle. Burning waste, injection, deposit or discharge of waste into the ground are not allowed as well as any spill or dumping of oil waste into surface, underground, coastal or marine waters or into wastewater drainage systems.

5. Collection Timetable

Collection will begin during normal working hours, on working days, from 8.00am to 12.00am and from 1.00pm to 5.00pm. When duly justified, waste may be collected outside the fixed timetable.

6. Marpol notification

Notification must be presented to the port authority at least 24 hours prior to the arrival. Notification may be presented within a shorter period of time if the port of call is not known until 24 hours prior to the arrival, or if it is only known at the latest upon departure from the previous port and the duration of the voyage is less than 24 hours. The notification form is available in JUP – MARPOL module, and can be filled online at <http://jup.portofigueiradafoz.pt/apffjup>.

7. Responsibilities

The master of a ship must supply real and accurate information concerning the waste that he intends to deliver, namely the type, the composition, the quantity and the collection time. He is also responsible for any damages caused due to insufficient, imprecise or incorrect information.

8. Reception Authorisation

The notification shall be assessed by the APFF Services or the Concessionaire, after verifying the reception facilities availability and setting the operation conditions.

9. Type of waste, quantity and collection method

The type of waste and the method of collection depending on its characteristics is specified in the enclosed Table.

Garbage, such as food waste, plastic and metal, paper and card, and other, must be disposed in appropriate containers, which are available in the Port terminals, providing the effective separation of the recyclable waste.

Other waste will be collected by the entity running the terminal, which will quantify it through measurement of the volume received or by weighing it on the weighbridge.

10. Location of Port waste reception facilities

11. Fees

The fees associated to the waste collection are outlined in the Waste Collection Tariffs Specific Regulations and are summed up in the enclosed Table (10% of the fees are allocated for the blue fund)

12. Marpol Certificate

APFF or the Terminal Concessionaire will issue a declaration confirming the waste collected, namely Marpol Certificate.

13. Complaints

Complaints regarding alleged inadequacies of port reception facilities shall be made by filling the form in and submitting it to the Port Administration. The form can be found at <http://jup.portofigueiradafoz.pt/apffjup> or on www.portofigueiradafoz.pt.

WASTE TYPES AND COLLECTION PROCEDURES

TYPE OF WASTE	COLLECTION METHOD
MARPOL ANNEX I (Waste oils) All waste that includes oils or derives from transport of hydrocarbons, such as used oils, sludges and oily waters (ballast waters and tank washing waters)	Collection within 48 hours of receiving MARPOL notification. It shall be collected by a road tanker, or in a container for quantities less than 1 cubic metre, and transported to an authorised waste management operator. Mixtures containing chemicals must be declared in accordance with the conventions in effect and are subject to prior sampling.
MARPOL ANNEX II (Noxious Liquid Substances, carried in bulk, including chemical products) This also includes waters used to wash tanks and cargo waste	These waste should be delivered to the receivers of commodities or stowage operators depending on the respective agreements made with these parties.
MARPOL ANNEX III (Harmful Substances, carried in packaged form)	These waste are classified as special waste. They should be packaged and declared in compliance with the IMO rules in force. Each container/deposit must be sealed, duly identified and accompanied by a letter of responsibility with list its contents, and transported to the provisional APA, S.A. park.
MARPOL ANNEX IV (Sewage) Includes wastewater from ships collected from sanitary installations, medical care premises, areas containing animals and other waters when mixed with the above (black and grey waters)	Collection within 48 hours of receiving MARPOL notification It shall be collected by a road tanker and the waste shall be transported to an authorised waste management operator.
MARPOL ANNEX V (Operational waste) Waste coming from normal operation of the ship and which are defined as: a) Garbage and animal by-products (food waste); b) Separate collections of plastic, metal packaged, paper and card, glass, small batteries and accumulators, ink and toner cartridges; and waste cooking oils; c) Non-hazardous cargo waste ready for elimination; d) Non-hazardous operational waste to be recycled; e) Other operational waste, including maintenance waste and ashes.	The following facilities are permanently available in the Aveiro Port, during normal working hours: a) Garbage and animal by-products (food waste) containers; b) Separate collection containers to plastic and metal; glass; paper and card, small batteries and accumulators, ink and toner cartridges and waste cooking oils; c) Containers for non-hazardous cargo waste; d) Locations for collection of wood and small quantities of scrap metal; e) The collection of other operational waste shall be analysed case by case, according to the characteristics and dimensions of the waste Extra containers shall be requested. A binding notice of 24 hours (garbage containers) or 48 hours (for other containers) is required.
